The Regular Meeting of the Lingle Town Council convened at 6:00 PM March 4, 2026 with Mayor Foster leading the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call, the following were present, constituting a quorum:

Mayor Foster welcomed all in attendance and thanked them for being present. Mayor Foster called for approval of the agenda. CM Wilhelm moved to approve the agenda with the addition of Bruce Hill to Public Comment. CM Jerome voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously. Mayor Foster called for approval of the minutes of the February 18, 2026 regular council meeting. CM Jerome moved to approve the minutes as presented. CM Wilhelm voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously.

**BILLS:** Council Member Wilhelm moved to approve payment of the town's bills for the month of February 2026, totaling \$102,688.99. Council Member Jerome voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:** Lingle resident Bruce Hill addressed the Council regarding the stop sign installed at the intersection of 7th Street and Freimuth Avenue. The Council informed Mr. Hill that the installation of the stop sign was agreed upon by consensus. Councilmember Jerome explained the rationale behind the installation. Following discussion, the Council assured Mr. Hill that his concerns regarding the stop sign would be taken into consideration. Resident George Siglin was recognized and addressed the Council, also commenting on the placement of the stop sign. Mr. Siglin noted that, in his years as a resident, no accidents have been reported at this intersection. He inquired about activity along the highway, to which TS Dailey responded that ADA compliance to the sidewalks is underway. Mr. Siglin further noted that gutters and storm drains are filled with dirt and debris. TS Dailey stated that the Maintenance Department is currently cleaning the gutters using the street sweeper. Additionally, Mr. Siglin identified issues with tree branches in the alleys. TS Dailey confirmed that these issues will be addressed.

**LEGAL ITEMS:** C/T Reyes reported: Ms. Barnes' office received two packets from the Chugwater Energy Project, one redacted and one complete. The permit for the Chugwater Energy Project was approved as of February 11, 2026. Per condition #2, Permittee shall commence construction within three years following the date of award of the permit. After construction starts then the Town of Lingle can begin requesting for impact assistance. Lingle was awarded \$52,075 in impact assistance. Lingle will have to spend funds, provide receipts, and then request reimbursements for funds in each budget area after construction on the Chugwater Energy Project starts. The Industrial Siting Council also requests annual report from each community about funding requests and expenditures.

MAINTENANCE ITEMS: TS Dailey reported: TS Dailey reported that ATS Jackson is attending the Recreation Board meeting. The Maintenance Department assisted Midwest Plumbing with a plumbing issue and has been addressing sewer concerns. The Tru-Green contract will be initiated this spring to maintain the park and cemetery. Eight trees have been removed at the cemetery; no replacements are planned at this time, and options are being explored for the cemetery if replacement is not feasible. TS Dailey also assisted the school with their Emergency Action Review. A Storm Spotter Training class will be held at the Lingle Community Center on April 14, 2026, at 6:30 PM. All residents are invited to attend.

LVFD ITEMS: CM Lambert reported: Six ambulance calls and six fire calls during the past month. Installation of heaters in the fire hall is scheduled to occur soon.

ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS: C/T Reyes reported: The Direct Distribution to Wyoming municipalities has been approved and signed by Governor Gordon. The estimated allocation for the Town of Lingle for the biennium is \$110,279. The election notice for the municipal election will appear in today's Telegram. Acceptance of nominations will begin March 6, 2026, for two Council positions and one Mayor position. The election is scheduled for May 5, 2026, from 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM at the Lingle Community Center.

With no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Foster adjourned the meeting at 6:42 p.m.
